



## Using Priced Out 2014 State/Local Data



*This is a sample document for CCD affiliates, advocates, and providers to assist in customizing local data from Priced Out 2014 to demonstrate the compelling crisis that extremely low-income people with disabilities face in specific states and communities.*

June 3, 2015- The Technical Assistance Collaborative (TAC) and the Consortium for Citizens with Disabilities (CCD) Housing Task Force have released, [Priced Out 2014](#), which demonstrates that the national average rent for a modestly priced one-bedroom apartment is greater than the entire monthly Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payment of a person with a disability. The study sheds light on the serious problems experienced by our nation's extremely low-income people with significant and long-term disabilities.

**In name of state/city**, *Priced Out in 2014*, reveals that persons with disabilities who rely on SSI to meet all their basic expenses, needed to pay **XXX%** of their monthly income to be able to rent a modest one-bedroom unit at the published Fair Market Rent **in the state/city**. Nationally, people with disabilities whose sole source of income is SSI payments must pay 104%.

“As many as 2 million non-elderly people with disabilities are impacted by this issue and reside in homeless shelters, public institutions, nursing homes, unsafe and overcrowded board and care homes, at home with aging parents, or in segregated group quarters,” said **CCD MEMBER CHAPTER/AFFILIATE**
